Course Description:

This course provides scenario- and simulation-based, hands-on training exercises presented for a multidisciplinary population of learners, including paramedic/firefighters, emergency medical technicians, hospital personnel, and law-enforcement officers.

- Recognize a potential terrorist incident and initiate incident operations,
- Implement personal and public safety protective measures,
- Perform appropriate decontamination,
- Implement the incident and unified command systems and perform effective intra- and inter-agency communication,
- Provide emergency medical care specific to incident / patient type(s).
